Additional information: For economic operators based in Denmark, Kredsløb will require an official certificate issued by the Danish Business Authority ("Serviceattest") as documentation for not being subject to exclusion grounds. For economic operators not based in Denmark but within the EU, Kredsløb expects to require the relevant documentation as listed in eCertis. If the economic operator is based outside the EU, Kredsløb expects to require (i) extracts from relevant registers or similar documents issued by a competent judicial or administrative authority stating that the economic operator is not subject to any of the exclusion grounds in the Danish Public Procurement Act, section 135(1) and (ii) (a certificate issued by the competent authority in the given country referred to as documentation that the economic operator is not subject to the grounds for exclusion stipulated in the cases stated in section 135(3) and section 137(1)(2). If the country in question does not issue the relevant documents or certificates, or if such documents or certificates do not cover all the cases mentioned in section 135 (1) or (3) and section 137(1)(2), those documents or certificates can be replaced by a statement provided under oath. If statements made under oath are not provided for in the relevant country, a solemn declaration made before a competent judicial or administrative authority, a notary, or a competent professional organisation in the country in which the economic operator is registered, will be accepted. The documentation provided should not be older than three months counting from the deadline for submission of applications and the deadline for submission of the final tender (BAFO) respectively. However, if longer validity is determined by the authority issuing the documentation or by the economic operator's national law and regulation, longer validity will be accepted. If an economic operator is subject to an exclusion ground, Kredsløb will ask the economic operator to document its reliability, cf. section 138 of the Danish Public Procurement Act, before Kredsløb determines whether the economic operator in question is non-eligible and must be rejected or replaced. Kredsløb will compensate tenderers for participation in the tender by payment of a lump sum of EUR 1,050,000 in total per tenderer. The compensation will be split into three (3) payments and each payment is conditional on submission of tender documents at a certain level which is described in details in the tender conditions. Certain parts of the tender material are considered

confidential by Kredsløb. Applicants or tenderers must sign the confidentiality agreement included in the tender material to get access to these parts of the tender material. Kredsløb will send the confidential parts of the tender material immediately after receiving and validating a confidentiality agreement signed by a potential applicant or pregualified tenderer.

Description: In the selection of applicants, Kredsløb will aim at pregualifying a diverse competition field representing different carbon capture technologies. Thus, if Kredsløb receives compliant applications representing at least two different technologies, Kredsløb will prequalify applicants representing at least two different technologies. For the purpose of identifying the best competition field, Kredsløb defines a technology based on the sorbent used i.e., different sorbents are different technologies whereas same sorbents treated differently are still defined as the same technology. Applicants must identify in their application, which technology the tender will be based on, and include at least one reference documenting the matureness (at least TRL 7) of that technology as described above. In order to identify the applicants to be prequalified, Kredsløb will initially review all applications for compliance with minimum requirements and exclusion grounds. Kredsløb reserves the right to ask applicants to submit, supplement, clarify or complete any incomplete or erroneous information in accordance with article 76(4) of the Utilities Directive. Kredsløb will then evaluate all compliant applications based on the references submitted and the company structure description above. References will carry more weight than the company structure description. Based on the evaluation, Kredsløb will rank the applications. The process described below is illustrated in the Tender Conditions. As a starting point, Kredsløb will prequalify the three (3) highest ranked applicants based on the evaluation of the references submitted and the company structure descriptions. However, if the three (3) highest ranked applicants all represent the same technology, Kredsløb will pregualify the highest ranked applicant representing a different technology together with the two (2) highest ranked applicants. If an economic operator is part of two teams of applicants (as applicant, consortium member or supporting entity) representing two different technologies and both teams are prequalified according to the system described above, Kredsløb will prequalify a fourth applicant based on the same prequalification criteria. If four applicants are prequalified, the fourth applicant being prequalified cannot represent a technology that is represented by two other pregualified applicants. In other words, including the fourth prequalified applicant, the competition field will include either three different technologies (where one is represented by two applicants) or two applicants representing one technology and two applicants representing another technology. Kredsløb will only prequalify a fourth applicant if the two teams where the same economic operator is involved represent different technologies i.e., if the same economic operator is involved in two applications representing the same

technology, Kredsløb will only prequalify three applicants. Furthermore, Kredsløb will only prequalify a fourth applicant if there is a fourth application representing a technology that is not already represented by two of the prequalified i.e., if the fourth applicant would be the third with the same technology, Kredsløb will only prequalify three applicants.

To fulfill the requirement of TRL 7, the applicant must document as a minimum a pre-commercial system, integrated, and tested in an operational environment compliant with flue gas from incineration of waste and /or biomass and/or oil and/or coal and/or natural gasfor a minimum continuous period of two (2) months. The minimum requirement may also be fulfilled by submission of a reference from a commercial plant that has been in operation for at least two (2) months. The reference or demonstration plant must not be older than ten (10) years from the deadline for apply-ing for prequalification. Plants that were put into operation prior to ten (ten) years before the deadline for applying for prequalification will not be taken into consideration.

References should be from either carbon capture plants or references from works of being mechanical and/or electrical EPC contractor (i.e., excluding civil works) for comparable projects (energy plants, process plants, industry, etc.). References should include a brief description of the tasks performed (e. g., scope of work, tasks performed by the applicant, technologies used (both carbon capture and other relevant technologies), client and other relevant parties involved, capacity or size of the plant/project, year of upstart, works and commissioning, value of the overall project and of the applicant's part respectively etc.). References must not be older than five (5) years from deadline for applying for pregualification. References from plants that were put into operation prior to five (5) years before the deadline for applying for prequalification will not be taken into consideration. Except the reference submitted to fulfill the minimum requirement which can be up to 10 years old. If the applicant submits ongoing references (i.e., plants not yet in operation), the current state of the works must be described and only works finished prior to the deadline for application for prequalification will be considered. If more than five (5) references are submitted, only the five (5) most recent references based on the time of commissioning will be considered. Kredsløb will identify the best qualified applicants based on the most comparable references combined with the company structure description. The evaluation of the most comparable references will be based on the up to five (5) references submitted plus the

reference or description of demonstration plants submitted to fulfil the minimum requirement. When evaluating comparability, Kredsløb will put emphasis on whether technologies demonstrated in the references are comparable to the project and the technology the applicant will use for the tender. It will be evaluated positively the more experience with carbon capture plants the applicant demonstrates, including higher TRL. However, references from other plants with high complexity will be evaluated positively as well. The higher complexity and the more comparable to carbon capture plants, the better evaluation. Furthermore, it will be evaluated positively if the references demonstrate experience with plants that are similar or larger in capacity than Kredsløb's project. In the evaluation references from plants put into operation will carry more weight than ongoing references.

Applicants are not required to name subsuppliers (but are welcome to) and it will be evaluated equally positively if the applicant merely identifies the areas of expertise where the applicant will include expertise from sub-suppliers and/or accounts for the capabilities being available internally-
